



Opportunity: RCP QI Breakthrough Collaborative – supporting teams to improve care for people with Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD)

Would you like to:

- Provide a high-quality, standardised IBD service in your organisation?
- Learn how to facilitate change and improvements in patient care?

If the answer to the above is **yes**, you are invited to join a quality improvement collaborative, consisting of three 1-day learning sessions and supported action periods, taking place over 9 months from November 2018 to June 2019.

Learning sessions to take place at the following locations (venue TBC):

- Learning session 1: London (late November 2018)
- Learning session 2: Liverpool (March 2019)
- Learning session 3: Location TBC dependent on locations of teams (June 2019)

Who can attend?

- People who want to improve IBD services for patients
- Up to 4 colleagues from each organisation can form a team to represent their organisation (eg medical staff, nursing staff, quality improvement leads, pharmacy staff, public health staff, patient representatives)

How much will it cost?

As a result of acquiring funding for this collaborative, we are able to offer this opportunity at a discounted rate of £2,000 per team (usual price: £3,000 per team). The cost includes attendance at all learning sessions and support from the QI faculty team in the subsequent action periods. Teams will need to cover their own travel/accommodation costs where necessary.
